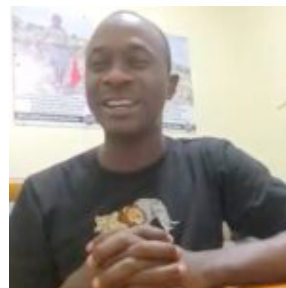

essays have been published widely, often shortlisted, in many places.



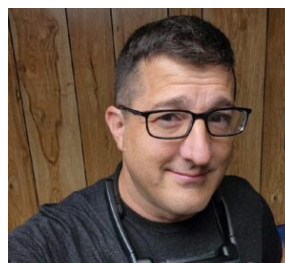
## Sugata Mitra and the End of Knowing

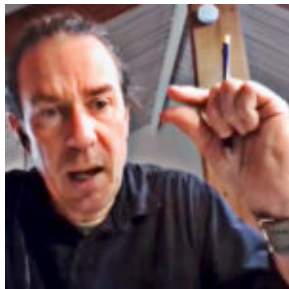
